Cecil County Chesapeake Bay Wade In June 17, 2017 10 AM— 2PM

Due to beach construction at Elk Neck State Park, Charlestown has been chosen as the site for the Cecil County 2017 Wade-In activities. A family friendly event, activities will take place from 10 AM to 2PM at the lot next to Fairgreen Park and at Foot

Log Park. The Fairgreen Park site will feature environmental exhibitor's and demonstrations in such areas as learning about local watersheds, water quality education, native and natural plantings, seine netting and fish ID, scales and tales by DNR, Plumpton Park Zoo, and live music and over 25 exhibitors. The Foot Log beach will be the site of the actual wade-in at 12:30 PM. Participants stand on the shore and "wade in" in a straight line until they can no longer see their shoes. You need to bring shoes that can get wet! This is a nonscientific check on the health of the Chesapeake Bay. Food vendors will also be available since the event spans the lunch hour. Walking, for our residents is the preferred way for you to get there, but there will be shuttle service from the elementary school for those who need to park their cars. Cecil transit will be providing the shuttle service.



Every week we get phone calls in the Town Hall about **trash blowing around** the neighborhoods because it is left out for the trash haulers unsecured. This seems to be especially true of recyclables now that they cannot be put into plastic bags. Please put your trash and recyclables in a container with a lid securely fastened on it. When trash is left to float around it ends up in a

neighbor's yard or in common areas not policed by anyone. This makes the town unsightly and annoys your neighbors who are picking your trash up out of their yards. Please be responsible and secure your trash. Thanks!

### Utility Rates Your current bill is due May 5, 2017

#### In Town Residences:

- Bay Restoration Fee \$15.00 per quarter
- Water minimum \$69.55 for 13,500 gallons
- 1000 gal. units, in excess of the 13,500 gal \$4.75
- Sewer minimum \$88.40 for 10,000 gallons
- 1000 gal. units, in excess of the 10,000 gal \$8.95

#### Out of Town Residences:

- Bay Restoration Fee \$15.00 per quarter
- Water minimum \$110.80 for 13,500 gallons
- 1000 gal units, in excess of the 13,500 gal \$5.40 Sewer minimum \$128.15 for 10,000 gallons
- 1000 gal. units in excess of the 10,000 \$13.30

The Bay Restoration Fee of \$15.00 per quarter is added to the sewer portion of water bills. If you pay your sewer fees to Cecil County directly, the \$15.00 is added to that bill and not your water bill.

There is a procedure in place to establish a payment plan for those experiencing a hardship in paying their bill.

Contact Town Hall (410-287-6173) to inquire about this procedure if you feel you might qualify.

## Failure to pay your bill on time results in the following procedure:

Your account will be assessed a penalty and an additional bill will be mailed to the address of record on May 8th.


Residences of unpaid bills as of May 17th will receive a door hanger notice of impending shutoff on or around May 18th.

Shutoffs at residences with unpaid balances over \$50.00 will occur on May 18th and an additional fee of \$50.00 will be added to the bill to facilitate shutoff and reconnection services.

### Did you know???????



Route #7 was called the Post Road leading from Philadelphia to Baltimore along which Washington and Ben Franklin often traveled. Charlestown's first Post Office was at the end of Market Street on Cecil Street. Shortly after it opened in 1776 higher authorities wanted to move the post office. It took some time for Charlestown officials to fight to retain the post office, and they did!!!! (until the train arrived in the 1850s.)

The first Postmaster was Patrick Hamilton appointed 5 Jan 1776. In 1786 Elizabeth Cresswell became Postmistress who was the second woman ever employed by the US government!

BUILDING PERMITS—No building or other structure shall be erected, moved, added to or structurally altered or use of land be changed without a permit. If you are in the Historic Area of Charlestown, there may be other regulations as well

#### Major Permit—\$50 -Examples

In ground swimming pools, garages, room additions, decks, patios, porches and/or enclosing thereof, solar panels, additional or changes to siding, windows, doors.

#### Minor Permit—\$20—Examples

- Fences,
- Tree Removal, major landscapir
- Above ground swimming pool, whole house generator
- Change of driveway surface
- Replacement of existing siding, windows or doors

#### What Goes In?


- Newspaper & magazines & catalogs
- Plastic & glass containers
- Aluminum & metal cans
- Clean Paperboard boxes
- Plastic trays wit food residual, paper plates
- Fruit, food waste
- Polystyrene foam
- Paper towels, tissues
- Wood & more



YARD WASTE will be collected by the Town Staff on the 2nd and 4th Monday of each

**month.** Grass, leaves, clippings, are collected in brown bags (preferred) (only filled with yard waste). Small limbs or branches not more than 3" in diameter, cut into 4ft lengths are accepted tied in bundles. Anything larger or in excess of 20lbs will not be picked up.

**BULK TRASH** will be picked up by appointment on the last Wednesday of each month by Town Staff. This service is for residents to dispose of a **few** large items, not a full clean out. Call Town Hall at 410-287-6173 or stop in to sign the bulk list.



Please be mindful of the dates for yard waste and bulk. Do not put these items out far in advance of the date of pick-up. Doing so invites animals to pick through it or try to nest, becomes overly waterlogged and extremely heavy and generally creates an eyesore. Thanks!



Would you like to join the ranks of the Charlestown Volunteer Fire Department? Give them a call on the non emergency number of 410-287-6451 to find out the requirements.

Cars continue to be a prime target of thieves. Remember to keep those windows up and doors locked! If you experience a loss or a break-in or attempted break-in please let the authorities know.

#### SAFETY TIPS

- Light the outside of your home
- Lock your doors, windows & install deadbolts
- Lock your car, roll up your windows, and put valuables out of sight
- Don't advertise your absence. Never leave an "away Message" on your answering machine or post on social media. Before you leave, set timers for lights, TV's & radios to go on & off.
- Inform MD State & Sheriff's Dept. that you are going to be away and get a "drive by property check". Forms can be picked up at Town Hall
