SECTION 1: BE IT ENACTED by the Commissioners of Charlestown by authority of Section 44 of Article 8 of the Code of Fublic Local Laws os Maryland, entitled "Cecil County" sub-title "Charlestown", that the following Section shall constitute an Ordinance for the regulations for issuance of building permits in the Town of Charlestown, and being known as Ordinance No. 4, and which regulations shall be as follows:

- (1) a. No building, wall, structure, fence or part thereof, shall hereafter be built, enlarged or altered, involving a cost to the owner of \$25.00 or more, without first having obtained a building permit from The Commissioners of Charlestown, or their agent.
- b. Both the owner of the property and the contractor engaged to do the work are equally responsible for obtaining the required building permit.
- c. Before any permit for construction to be completed in the Town of Charlestown shall be issued, the applicant shall file with The Commissioners of Charlestown an application, supported by an affidavit, wherein shall be specified the contract price of the construction in its entirety, the type of construction to be completed, the material to be used and such other information as shall be required thereon. This application shall be accompanied by a sketch showing the proposed location of the building on the lot and the front yard, side yard, and rear yard dimensions, as well as the location of the nearest street line.
 - d. A fee of \$1.00 will be charged for all building permits.
- e. Any person or persons violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined Twenty Five Dollars (\$25.00) or sentenced to not more than thirty (30) days confinement, or both.

SECTION 2: BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Ordinance shall take effect from the date of its passage.

At this meeting there was an unanimous vote in favor of the proposed school being constructed south of the Penna. Railroad line within the corporate limits of Charlestown.

Mr. Charles Dennison and Mr. Ross Patchell were present this evening to request that the Commissioners take an action at this meeting to back up the citizens of Charlestown, and to write a letter, explaining the action taken, to the Board of Education of Cecil County with copies to the County Commissioners, the Parent Teachers Association of Charlestown, and the Better Schools Association of Charlestown.

CURBING PROPOSED FOR BLADEN STREET

After the exact measurements were taken on Bladen St., it was found that it is impossible to put in curbing at this time. The edge of the 60 foot Street is 19'72" from Shockley's Store, 17'8" from corner of Post Office, and 20' from the Charlestown Market.

It was decided that the State Reads Commission should be advised as to the location of Bladen Street and request that Bladen Street be relocated. This was made in form of a motion by Mr. Lynch and seconded by Mr. Ralph Murphy. Motion passed.

WATER STREET PROJECT

A letter was received from the Conowingo Power Company stating that they expect to have the poles on Water Street moved by April 205h.

The bids for completing two blocks on Water Street were read. E. E. Twyford & Son bid \$4,604.00 and the United Paving Company bid \$4,165.00.

Mr. Howard Lynch made a motion that the United Paving Company be awarded the hid if provisions can be made to make payment on this job according to the limitations of the budget. Motion seconded by W. G. Murphy, and passed.

ORDINANCE NO. 6

SECTION 1: BE IT ENACTED by the Commissioners of Charlestown by authority of Section 44 of Article 8 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, entitled "Cecil County" sub-title "Charlestown", that the following Section shall constitute an Ordinance for the regulation of use of the town dump, and being known as Ordinance No. 5, and shall read as follows:

No person or persons shall dump any refuse, garbage, trash or other materials in the area designated as the town dump without advance permission of the Commissioners of Charlestown. The regular meeting of the Board of Town Commissioners was held in the Fire House August 11, 1956 and called to order at 7:40 by Robert E. Phillips.

The following Commissioners were present: Robert E. Phillips, Howard R. Lynch and W. G. Murphy. Mr. John B. Wright, Legal Counselor for the Commissioners was also present at the meeting.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and one correction made.

LEGAL CASE

A letter was received from Mr. John Wright dated August 4, 1956 in which he state that Judge Kintner signed the final decree to complete all court action in the Haldas Case on August 2nd and the decree stated as follows:

"That the relief prayed for in the plaintiff's bill be, and the same is hereby, denied, and the bill dismissed with prejudice.

That the plaintiff shall pay the costs of this case in this court."

The Commissioners asked Mr. Wright to explain the word prejudice as stated above. Mr. Wright explained that prejudice means that the same action cannot be brought again by this plaintiff.
