As always, our staff has been working hard to keep you updated on the latest developments and happenings in our town. ## UTILITY BILL PAYMENTS DUE FEBRUARY 12TH!

We made a few changes in the fourth quarter of 2023 that we want to ensure you are aware of. Firstly, we recently upgraded our website to make it more user-friendly, and in addition to that, have launched an app, called Historic Charlestown, that provides Town news and updates in an instant. We encourage all residents to download the app today on your iOS or Android device to receive critical updates as soon as they are available. Also, we have revised the hours at Town Hall to 8:30am-4:30pm, Monday through Friday. If you need help outside of these hours, please contact Town Hall for an appointment. Lastly, the parking lot at Veteran's Park is now for residents only. To obtain a parking permit, residents can get one for free at Town Hall during business hours.

At the Maryland Municipal League Conference in October, the Town was awarded the Sustainable Maryland Certification, which is the first for a Cecil County Municipality. We are honored and look forward to partnering with Sustainable Maryland and the University of Maryland as we look to strengthen the long-term sustainability of our Town.



In December, the Commissioners took a step towards improving the Town's code enforcement process by initiating the hiring process of a Code Enforcement Officer. The decision to hire Kenneth Hamilton during the legislative meeting on January 9th is a positive move towards ensuring compliance with Town ordinances and zoning codes. With his extensive knowledge of code implementation and customer service, he will be an asset to the Town. He will closely collaborate with the Town Administrator, Bryan Lightner, to ensure the Commissioners are presented with ideas for updating codes, residents are educated about the codes and provided with support for zoning permits, and the codes are effectively enforced. We welcome him to the Town Hall staff and encourage residents to say hello when they see him around town.

## 2024 MUNICIPAL ELECTION

### THREE (3) COMMISSIONER SEATS ARE UP FOR ELECTION

The Charlestown Board of Supervisors of Elections will hold the 2024 Municipal Election on **Tuesday, March 5, 2024 from 7:00AM to 7:00PM** at the Town Hall Building, 241 Market Street, Charlestown.

In order to be eligible to vote, you must be at least eighteen (18) years of age and be a town resident for three (3) months prior to the election.

If you would like an absentee ballot, contact Town Hall at (410) 287-6173, ext. 1.

If you are considering candidacy, there are a few things you need to know:

- QUALIFICATIONS: You must be a resident of Charlestown for at least one (1) year, be at least twenty-one (21) years of age, and be qualified to vote.
- How to APPLY: There are no write-ins on the ballot, so all candidates for Commissioner must apply. If interested, please submit an application, which can be found on the Town's website or at Town Hall, along with a recent photo and short biography on your background and pertinent experience related to the Commissioner position. **The deadline to apply is February 2, 2024 at 4:00pm.**
- WHAT TO EXPECT: Commissioners attend two (2) meetings per month to discuss policy, ordinances, expenditures, and civic progress. They also attend Town and County events, and help create a civic culture of mutual respect.

There will be a **Candidates Forum at the Fire Hall on February 20th at 6pm**, where the public can attend in person and ask questions of the candidates who filed for Town Commissioner. **Also, election results will be counted live via Zoom in the evening on Election Day.** The link to join will be available on our website.

#### IMPORTANT TRASH & RECYCLABLES COLLECTION REMINDERS

- **Bin color is important.** Bins provided by Trash Tech with dark-colored lids (blue or black) are for trash, and light-colored lids (yellow or orange) are for recyclables. Mixing these bins up may cause missed collection by Trash Tech.
- Trash and recyclables cannot be mixed. Contaminated recyclables will not be collected. Please follow Cecil County's single stream recycling guidelines, located on our website at <a href="www.charlestownmd.org/trash-recyclables">www.charlestownmd.org/trash-recyclables</a>.
- Recyclables must be contained within bins. Large boxes that are unable to be broken down must be taken to the Cecil County Landfill by residents, or collection must be scheduled as bulk trash for Town Maintenance Staff to collect.
- Bulk trash items must be separated from household trash. The Town Maintenance Staff collects bulk items on the last Wednesday of each month, but these items must be separated from household trash to avoid missed collection by Trash Tech. Bulk trash collections are limited to four (4) large items per household, but if you have more than the allowance, a pickup can be scheduled for \$150 per truckload, with a max of three (3) truckloads.
- If your trash or recyclables are not collected by 4:30pm on Wednesday, please notify Town Hall no later than 12:00pm on Thursday.

## JANUARY 19TH-HAPPY HOUR AT THE P. K. BARNES ICE HOUSE, 4PM.

Brief History: Built circa 1890. Located at Veteran's Park, Market & Water Streets. This building was built in the 19th Century by Captain Perry K. Barnes to supplement his large commercial fishing business, and was used to store ice harvested from the river. The building has been preserved by Jeanette Armour and Sonny Diamonte and is now a museum that beautifully showcases this rich piece of Charlestown's history.

Hosted by Colonial Charlestown. Sip hot chocolate, enjoy light fair, and tour of the Tory House. Hors d'ouevres provided by Market Street Café. Located at 343 Market St, parking lot on Cecil Street. Free event.

Brief History: Built circa 1750. The original deed for the property describes a building, which was somehow destroyed. Around 1810, the foundation was reused for the present structure, which still contains the tavern kitch-

en in the basement. Rumored, but not true, is that the property was sold in 1802 by the state of Maryland, which may have confiscated it from a Tory during the Revolution of the Revoluti tionary War, thus it's name "Tory House." It has been restored through the efforts of Colonial Charlestown, Inc., a 501c3 nonprofit organization.
